

#StopTheDebtTrap Internship

Americans for Financial Reform's #StopTheDebtTrap Campaign is seeking a fall intern. Join us to help lead the fight against payday lending abuses, and to push back against right wing attacks on consumer financial protection.

There is a tremendous opportunity this fall to win rules that will end the payday lending debt trap. Payday lending is an industry based on luring low-income consumers into high interest loans that catch them in a cycle of debt. Since the CFPB first announced its plan to regulate these abusive lenders a year ago, the industry has stripped \$8.9 billion from borrowers; its triple digit interest rates are a shocking instance of the poor paying more; and it further impoverishes economically vulnerable individuals and households. Ending these practices would have a tremendous impact. But the loan sharks who profit from these practices - and their friends in Washington - will resist with all their might and are spending tens of millions to do it.

Responsibilities include:

- Maintain lists and spreadsheets during a crucial time in a regulatory rulemaking process;
- Support a field advocacy campaign;
- Maintain field materials such as factsheets, toolkits and web resources;
- Promoting our message by contributing to and implementing communications, new media and outreach plans; and
- Help organize and manage press and outreach events.

Qualifications: Ideal candidates will have a strong commitment to economic justice; excellent written and oral communication skills; high proficiency with general office software (Microsoft Word, Excel, Paint and PowerPoint preferred); and knowledge and experience with website maintenance, blogging, and social networks. We are also looking for someone who is detail oriented, has solid judgement and good relationship-building skills, and a sense of humor.

Although the position is unpaid, we offer a \$10-a-day expense stipend plus valuable, stimulating, soul-satisfying work and a crash course in public-interest advocacy, financial regulation, communications and coalition building. This is a great opportunity for individuals seeking to enter the nonprofit advocacy world. Academic credit available.
